In our mobile clinics participants have a hands-on life changing experience while providing basic healthcare to remote, underserved, Central-american communities to help improve their overall health and well-being.

Preventive healthcare is a priority for vida. The Public Health Promotion module allows the student to personally get to know and understand the conditions of how underserved families live and how they can affect a person's health.

DENTAL:

Through our dental program the student gets an interactive shadowing experience helping Central American patients as they learn basic dental techniques.

Participants will have the responsibility to help educate and motivate individuals about healthy dental habits while actively participating in the on-site clinic administration.

Community Projects

NICARAGUA

1. Partnership - Raleigh Internacional: Community of Los Manguitos, Masaya, characterization of and implementation of educational workshops about climate change, recycling, healthy life styles (hygyne and diet).
2. Rivas Mata, Caña: 5 wells were drilled in the community together with Living Water International.



GUATEMALA

1. El Tunino, Sacatepéquez: +3 miles of OVC pipelining benefited about 30 families' health and daily chores.
2. Santa Catarina, Ixtahuacán: Vida provided specialized equipment for the childbirth care center at the local Permanent Care Center. This center treats over 110 surrounding communities.



COSTA RICA

1. STEVIA Project:

The Stevia Project was completed with the assistance of different staff members and the input of a high school stevia researcher. 12 families were selected for the project, according to our statistics from the community of "Barrio Irving". They were visited and interviewed to form part of the program. The first visit for these families took place in January 2017.

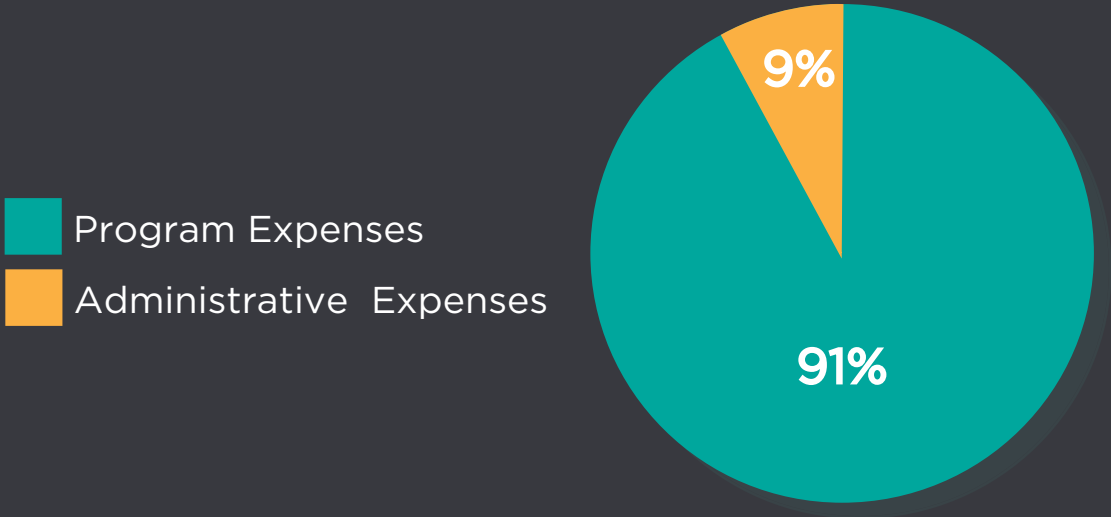
