To positively impact the quality of life in underserved communities while offering volunteers a life changing experience.

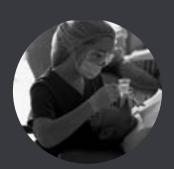

Preventive healthcare is a priority for vida. The Public H ealth Promotion module a llows the student to personally get to know and understand the conditions of how underserved families live and how they can a ffect a p erson's health.





Through our dental program the student g ets an interactive shadowing experience helping Central American patients as they learn basic dental techniques.

Participants will h ave the responsibility to help educate and motivate individuals about healthy dental habits while actively participating in the on-site clinic administration.





Through the Veterinary Program students participate in general consultations for animals and help improve their overall well-being. As well as assist the doctors in the spaying and neutering clinics.

The International Veterinary Training Center (IVTC) in Costa Rica is part of the Vida's Veterinary area. 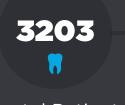

NICARAGUA

- 1. Partnership Raleigh Internacional: Community of Los Manguitos, Masaya, caractherization of and implementation of educational workshops about climate change, recycling, healthy life styles (hygyne and diet).
- 2. Rivas Mata, Caña: 5 wells were drilled in the community together with Living Water International.



GUATEMALA

- 1. El Tunino, Sacatepéquez: +3 miles of OVC pipelining benefited about 30 families´ health and daily chores.
- 2. Santa Catarina, Ixtahuacán: Vida provided specialized equipment for the childbirth care center at the local Permanent Care Center.
 This center treats over 110 surrounding communities.

1. STEVIA Project:

The Stevia Project was completed with the assistance of different staff members and the input of a high school stevia researcher. 12 families were selected for the project, according to our statistics from the community of "Barrio Irving". They where visited and interviewed to form part of the program. The first visit for these families took place in January 2017.

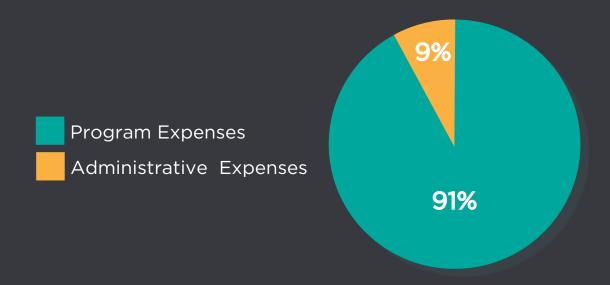
